**Call to Order** Wendy Marucheck called the meeting to order at 9:30 am and led introductions. Proper notice of the meeting was given and a quorum present. A sign-in sheet is attached to the original minutes.

**President's Report** Wendy Marucheck reported the following information:

- Thanks to committee chairs and volunteers. Thank you slides attached.
- Council meeting Issaquah food and clothing bank are running two drives: Holiday gift barn and lunch for the break. Superintendent Ron Thiele spoke. He talked about the proposed new schedule for next year. It is highly likely IHS will have 7 or 8 periods next year. The decision is to be made in January.
- Plans for new high school are moving along (near Providence Point). Still at least 2 years out.
- New middle school. Location TBD (possibilities either behind Issaquah Valley Elementary or bottom of Talus).
- Need people for the nominating committee at January 11 meeting. Need three people on the committee. Elections for the committee will be held at the January 11th meeting.

## **Secretary's Report** (Kristin Brennock)

The September 2018 minutes were reviewed, approved with no changes, and filed.

## Treasurer's Report (Blyth Claeys)

Blyth Claeys presented the October 2018 Financial report.

Blyth noted the following items:

- 990 filed Nov. 14 (taxes), charitable organization renewal Nov. 14th
- The October 2018 bank statements were reviewed by Elizabeth McIntyre.

### **Business**

**Grants:** Two grants were submitted. Only moving one grant moved to a vote. Robotics grant was for transportation and we didn't support because our insurance policy doesn't allow us to support transportation.

Comprehensible Input Supplemental Material- Susan Stimmel is an IHS Spanish teacher. Submitted grant for online program. Online reading that would help increase interest with kids. Would like to purchase pilot program - one class and for teachers to use. \$560 total. Used immediately (as soon as approval) expose students to more cultural. Help kids grow. Hoping district will pay to

upgrade curriculum. Grant committee recommends that we approve the grant for \$560. 16 votes and 16 yes. Grant will be approved.

Awards: Marni Kilzi - Asking for nominations for Golden Acorn Award and Outstanding Student Advocate Award. Golden Acorn is for work done here at school. Outstanding Student Advocate is work done to benefit kids in district and community. There is a link to the nomination form on the PTSA page in Programs. Work should have been preformed durning Jan 2018 to Dec 2018. Our goal is to get a lot of nominations. Also need committee members to review applications on Feb 25th.

### **Speakers**

Kelly Henry - ASB Director: 6th year at IHS. Was Chemistry teacher, various drama events. Sept. Homecoming 1313 students came. Thursday before Homecoming took requests and had dance competition at dance for Beyonce tickets - gave out 4 tickets. On Oct 26th held a blood drive. 101 students signed up. Sign up filled up two days before event. There were 75 whole blood donations and 59 first time donors. There are two more schduled for Feb 1st and April 5th. In April they are possibly bring their bus, so community members can donate. ASB hosted a Halloween Fair - went surprisingly well. Couple booths, corn hole, trivia booth, franked smoothy (kids could spin three times to see what would end up in the smoothy), face painting. Senate meeting is being held during Nest so more of the student body come in, not just class. Club presidents, team captains and 2nd period reps. She has lessened the number of senate meetings.
