# President's Report - Anne Watanabe

- The new Council Board was elected at yesterday's PTA Council Meeting.

#### Principal's Report – Andrea McCormick

- Andrea reported we will be receiving portables, and they will be placed back by the stadium. She will update us as she
  gets more information.
- The staff is working on the master schedule. The process is that the students make their selections, and then there are divisions with number of classes. Scheduling then gets juggled by maximizing the minimum number of conflicts with special requests. Rough schedules will be available next week on Skyward.
- Andrea will be holding a Meet and Greet for parents for lunch on May 9<sup>th</sup> after the PTSA meeting. Please join her!
- Andrea mentioned there will be a number of grants coming next month to the PTSA for consideration- Sound system
  (top priority), safety visitor badges, black box theater lighting. She said she would be happy to provide what additional
  funding (Booster, ASB and Building funds) is available or has already been used to help the PTSA evaluate the
  applications.
- Andrea spoke about Summer School and its value in helping students in need of passing classes. She said it has a higher pass rate and that it is recommended to take both sections, if it is needed. There is also a 7<sup>th</sup> period credit retrieval program. It serves as a study and help session to help pass the assessments. The failing grade still stays on the transcript, but the students will receive an S (pass) grade upon successful completion and will then have those credits for graduation. In addition, the staff is separating interventions next year into categories for students who lack executive functioning skills vs the kids who are intentional non-learners.

The bill redefines the state's "Program of Basic Education" and the funding amounts and methods needed to fully support it. Full implementation of the bill must be completed by 2018. ESHB 2261 includes the following enhancements to our state's education system:

- Increased instructional hours.
- Enhanced high school diploma requirements.
- New transportation funding formula.
- All-day kindergarten added to basic education.
- New finance structure for transparency.
