Secretary's Report (Sara Carmichael)

Business

The signed report was handed to President Bertina Loeffler Sedlack and the committee was thanked for its work.

President Bertina Loeffler Sedlack re-read the proposed slate of officers. There were no additional nominations from the floor and the president declared the nominations closed.

MOTION 2 Kristen Allen-Bentsen moved to elect the slate of nominees in its entirety as presented. Seconded. The Officers for IH PTSA 2017-2018 are duly elected.

Filling Executive Committee Vacancies The offices of Co-President, VP Events, and VP Communications remain open. Bertina noted that the current Board of Directors takes ownership to fill the open positions. She is hoping to fill the vacancies as soon as possible in order to get the new officers trained and up to speed.

WSPTA Convention Bertina noted that the Washington State PTA State Convention is April 28-30. Newly elected officers should take advantage of this. Diane or Bertina will email Convention details. Sara Carmichael and Patti Miller will attend the Awards Reception on Friday evening.

Voting delegates must be identified by April 21. Voting delegates represent IH PTSA when state PTA matters are voted on. Voting delegates do not have to be an elected officer. Diane will be going Saturday afternoon and Sunday.

Committee Reports

Advocacy Dea Barnett reported that the legislative session ends April 23 but could be extended into a special session. She encouraged people to call and email legislators with your opinions.

Membership Bertina reported that our membership is at 1,409, including 63 staff members (an increase of one staff member).

Awards Marla Baldinaldi reported that Outstanding Educator nominations are open through April 16, midnight. She showed a promotional flyer for Outstanding Educator designed by a student in the graphic design class. These flyers will be posted around the school. Marla thanked Valerie Yanni and the Communications team for generating great publicity.

Bertina noted that Heidi Fuhs, Sara Carmichael, Barb Howe & Bertina attended the Golden Acorn/Outstanding Advocate reception.

Programs

Parent Ed Dea Barnett noted that the ParentWiser event featuring Jessica Lahey speaking about her book <u>The Gift of Failure</u> is coming up on April 25 (10:00am at Village Theatre FIRST Stage and 7:00pm at IHS Auditorium). Onti Rosen has checked out two Parent Ed Library copies of the book. A follow-up discussion session will be scheduled later.

Healthy Student Ami Maron provided an update about activities surrounding the Be True campaign. A survey of students was conducted in March; Kids seem to be connecting with the campaign. Ami has ordered mechanical pencils with the Be True message on them that will be handed out to all students. The committee is also working on something for Prom. Ami expects the program to continue in the fall. Healthy Youth Survey results should be available before end of the school year.

Community Service Onti Rosen noted that current seniors must submit volunteer hours by May 2nd. The process is all online.

Grants Margaret Chalfant noted that the deadline for the third round of grants is April 21.

Senior Scholarships Onti Rosen reported that applications for Senior Scholarships are due April 17, right after spring break.

College Test Prep A Combination ACT/SAT test will be held May 20th. An ACT preparation course begins April 22. Sign up now.

Angel Onti Rosen announced that the Angel program is collecting long prom dresses, coats, and gift cards for Spring Break. Julie Siefkes, Angel Co-Chair, "starred" in an iVision video about the Angel Program. The link to the video will be added to the IH PTSA website. Patti Miller noted that the Angel Program is using their budgeted funds well.

New Family Ambassador The committee is planning an event for April 20.

Parent Ed Library Onti Rosen will accept book donations to help build the Parent Library. She will look into what to do with donations of ACT/SAT prep books. Onti and Dea Barnett are working on where to store books.

Other Diane and Bertina spoke with Lotte Torgersen, EA, who has been paying out of pocket to feed some of the LRC students. Funds could come from Angel or Health Room Snacks. Onti Rosen will work with Linda Liske about this issue for next year.

Events

Senior Events Sally Feldman reported that 235 students have signed up for the senior party. The committee has employed various approaches the past two weeks to increase participation. The Senior Farewell logo is being tweaked. Our Roots is the theme to convey a celebration of growth and learning. Auditions are May 3, 9 and 10, before and after school. They are still looking for a key note speaker. The committee is selling Graduation Pride Signs (similar to Booster's Going to State signs) to help cover Senior Farewell costs. The graphics design class is designing the signs.

Erin Connolly, Activities Director Erin Connolly reported that Tolo had a good turnout with ticket sales on par with last year. She appreciated the assistance of parent chaperones. • The ASB executive board, ASB class, and class representatives have all been chosen. • A Cram the Stands event is coming up in April. • The Color Run is being rescheduled to May 24. • Meetings for ASB budgeting and scheduling for next year will be April 17 and 18. Homecoming will be September 23, 2017. • The Prom is June 3 at EMP. • Not as many AP Care Packages were purchased compared to previous years. The Raise the Paddle fundraiser for Prom has been extended.

Nick Schiermeyer, Teacher Nick Schiermeyer spoke about the Issaquah Radio Station, for which IH PTSA approved a grant for equipment. ISF and IHS Boosters also contributed funds. Radio spots are available at Issaquahradio.org. He shared his uncontainable enthusiasm for the station, projects his class is currently working on, plans for developing more advanced classes, and the endless broadcast possibilities (sports, concerts, student works, etc...).
