What is your education background?

I have a B.A. in History and English from Western Washington University, an M.A. in English Literature from the Catholic University of America, and an M.Ed from the University of Washington.

Did you grow up around Issaquah? If not, where did you grow up and did that help shape the person you are today?

I grew up relatively nearby in Redmond. One of my best friends growing up lived in Issaquah (off May Valley Rd) and so I came here frequently, as well as attending Village Theatre (and performing in a KidStage production a LONG time ago). I loved growing up in the Pacific Northwest.
