We serve


 We support ALL students with disabilities or suspected disabilities residing within the Issaquah School District boundaries, and their families



IEP and 504 Students (17%)



State test scores for students with 504s

69.4% were proficient in English Language Arts 56.2%were proficient in math 49.3% were proficient in science

State test scores for students with IEPs

27.4% were proficient in English Language Arts21.6% were proficient in math26.6% were proficient in science



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Why did we form?

There was no existing organization like this.

- Students and families can feel isolated and unheard
- The disabilities community is spread across 26 ISD schools

We needed a cohesive, formal organization.

- There were multiple individual informal groups across the district
- Chartered PTSA status and 501(c)3 status means we can have more impact

We want our families and students to have a voice in the ISD.

- Create a strong and vibrant community
- Advocate for improvements and change
- Listening to students' experiences, voices, and opinions



Formation & Activities

Formation

- Chartered in May 2022 with 72 Charter Members
- Formed as an affiliate under the Washington State PTA
- Registered as a 501(c)3 nonprofit and charitable organization
- Set up communications on the district's "411" e-news
- Set up website and social media sites, including a public Facebook and Instagram page and a members-only Facebook discussion group

- Getting to know key administrators in the district
- Introducing our group to other local PTAs
- Working on our community building, education and advocacy goals
- Striving to reach families and increase membership
- State level WS PTSA Special Education Committee



Unique organization

This PTSA is a little unique...

- ◆ We cover <u>all schools</u> and <u>all grade levels</u>
- ◆ We serve students ages 3 to 21, and their families
- ◆ We are active in a <u>statewide PTA Special Education Committee</u>
- ◆ We are the first <u>districtwide</u> PTSA in Issaquah
 - There are ten other districtwide Special Education PTAs in our state, including: Bellevue, Benton-Franklin County, Everett, Federal Way, Puyallup (Pierce Cty), Highline / Burien, Issaquah (us), Seattle, Shoreline and Tacoma.
 - There are other types of districtwide PTAs in WA, including some for music programs and a Chinese PTA in Bellevue.

Current Membership

April 2023: 181 members

- 16 out of 16 elementary schools
- 6 out of 6 middle schools
- 4 out of 4 high schools
- 17 Staff Members
