Speakers

Heather Tow-yick, Issaquah School District Superintendent

- Thanked everyone for coming to the meeting and had everyone introduce themselves and share our favorite thing about our students.
 - Three big topics on her mind
 - Equity and Experience of our Students
 - Strategic Planning
 - Budget
- High School # 4 -
 - Desire for augmented, skills-relevant opportunities environment to learn in current schools are built on an outdated model
 - The new school will be built on an updated model
 - Need to relieve overcrowding
 - Really looking at what is the purpose of our high school learning
 - Having to revisit the funding plan due to higher costs
 - Taking the opportunity to take another look at what we really need for the future
 - Don't anticipate re-bounderying in the next year and a half
- Was asked about sports and extracurriculars beyond the school day in elementary schools for example 5th grade orchestra will need to look into that and how we would fund
- Was asked about how to identify gifted students in elementary through high school how can we challenge our students in a better way discussed how we can challenge individuals in the school district
- Was asked about the budget and how ISD parents can advocate to the state on how our district is funded will be sure to share contact information when the district feels there is a need for parents to engage
- Was asked about foreign language offerings in middle school there is a continued topic of course offerings, including additional and expanded foreign language offerings will not be offering additional offerings next year due to cuts
- Was asked about PE requiring the 5k for all students vs. providing other aerobic activities the 5k is no longer part of the IHS PE program
- Teachers are working on offering alternative opportunities to show mastery of a subject

Erin Connolly, Principal:

- School Improvement Plan
 - Focus on graduation rates 90-94% historically, but disproportionality exists between groups
 - Overall: 2020-21 school year = 94.1%; 2021-22 school year 96.7% (includes the help of waivers)
 - Black students: 81.3% and 88.2% for the same time periods
 - Latinx students: 82.9% and 92.2% for the same time periods
 - 2024 overall goal of 95% w/focus area closing the gap for Black and Latinx students
 - Staff Professional Development to help service all students

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- Aligning curriculum and grading practices
- Increased credit recovery options -
 - allowing guided studies (pass/fail option)
 - offering after-school credit recovery through an online class in canvas
 - identifying students in the last 6 weeks of the semester who will likely not be able to pass a class and offering credit recovery modules
- Attendance is a key indicator of whether or not students graduate
 - implemented hall passes to better determine who should be in class no passes in the first and last 10 minutes of class
 - assistant principals ran reports with 10+ day absences and proactively set up meetings with families to discuss best supports to increase attendance
- counselors working with small groups based on needs assessment
- offering mental health support offerings
- math support twice a week homework labs available, NEST offerings, pre-algebra course now available, added support classes for second semester - students automatically registered for the teacher-recommended course next year, but there is an appeal process
- focus on 9th graders evidence shows students ending 9th grade with at least 6 credits graduate at a much higher rate - connection to the community - mentorships - added 9th grade guided studies trying to reduce class sizes in core 9th-grade classes
- Discussed how to better support Running Start students who are struggling unfortunately, IHS is not notified about grades until the end of the quarter
- SAT at IHS for Juniors on March 22 registered students will receive an email with instructions
- Students were automatically registered for teacher-recommended math class, but there is an appeal process
- Course registration re-opens the first week of April so students can review which classes they registered for there are several classes that did not have enough students register for and will be canceled
- TOLO is April 1 tickets are available April 13-30 from the bookkeeper form is needed if students intend to bring someone from another school

- Finals schedule will be released by March 16
