Angel Program – Laurie Foreman

This is the 3rd year of this program. The program has a staff person who works with them because it is highly confidential. This year there was a lot of requests to pay for ASB fees. This program also stocks and maintains the Angel Closest; please donate gently used teen and tween clothes.

Community Service Program – Bertina Loeffler Sedlack

Promotes activism, helping in the community; graduates need to have completed 50 hours of community service of class of 2015. Will really try and promote the program this year. The graduates get to wear a gold honor cord at graduation. Next year, graduates will require 75 hours and the next 100. This is the goal. This program is open to everyone.

Reflections - Sandi Lum

They need volunteers to serve as judges in November.

Principal – Andrea McCormick

- Thanked everyone for their support of the back to school events! She reported that
 there is a very positive mood at the school so far. Issaquah High has 20 new staff
 members including two new vice principals, Ms. Bamba and Mr. Desautels. Miss
 Zielinski is the new counselor for students with last names ending in I Mi.
- Nutrition Policy Changes: They have had several complaints but it is state law that is mandating these changes (mainly portion sizes). These changes are only enforced during the school day.
- Registration Issues: It went relatively smoothly this year. There are new procedures
 which made this process easier. She took notes on "schedule change requests"
 procedures (dealing with communication) that frustrated parents.
- Dress Code: There are guidelines in the Student Handbook. Teachers can refer kids to administration if they feel they are in violation of the dress code. The kids are asked to change and they comply. They rarely get repeat offenders.
- Signage they want to invest in signs that maintain the aesthetics of the building. There
 is an electronic reader board at entrance.
- Library Opening it is a funding issue; it will require staffing; they are looking into setting up a print to pay system as well.
- Friends of Youth They are holding a fundraiser: "Rise and Thrive Breakfast" on November 12 from 7:30-8:30 am at Pickering Barn to help raise money to bring more counselors to ISD.
- 7th Period Classes Enrollment is good so far: 4 classes are being offered (cross fit, astronomy, health and vet science); in addition, they are offering credit recovery classes (math and English) at no fee. Spring 7th period registration will go live in December. 7th Period is in a trial phase so they are not sure of the future of this program.

ASB Advisor – Erin Schiermeyer

Erin reports that ASB has lots of fun programs that they sponsor. The ASB website (found under the "Activities" tab on the IH website) will be updated after the 18th. Club advisors will be contacting anybody that signed up. There will be a Clubs Fair in early October.

Homecoming is the week of October 20 - 26th. They are working on ideas to get kids to stay at the dance and not just come and get their pictures taken.
