- IH PTSA has received appreciative notes for the gift certificates given to the teachers who received their National Board Certifications and for grants the PTSA approved.
- The Reflections reception was held, four IHS students are moving forward to the State competition.

• Principal's Meeting Report

 The Co-Presidents discussed the Optimal High School Experience, structuring of the Angel Program, a possible Grand Re-Opening (which is not currently scheduled), and the Mid-Year Review.

Council Report

- The Optimal High School Experience and TPEP (teacher evaluation process) were discussed.
- 24 teachers in the Issaquah School District achieved their National Board Certification.
- The movie *Finding Kind*, about bullying, will be shown February 1st at IHS. Admission is free, boys and girls grades 6-12 and adults are welcome.
- Washington State PTA is holding an essay contest for students on the topic of male figures who have influenced them. The winner will be announced at Convention in May.
