





This lunch group is being put together to support students with social/communication disabilities gain a lunch group to eat with 2x a month. Many of these students eat alone daily. The function of the lunch is to promote social engagement with other students and help them gain the social skills to support the formation of friendships. These lunches will be supervised by the school social worker, support staff, and or other certificated staff in the building who will provide a structure and sometimes social lessons for the group.

So many of our students are eating lunch alone because they don't know how to approach others to join them for lunch, or are uncomfortable doing so. This is especially true in our post-pandemic social climate.


